After almost 10 years of operation, the NDIS is set for a reboot. Minister Shorten outlined six key areas of reform in an address to the National Press Club last month. The announcement follows the Government's review of the Scheme.

More than half a million Australians receive support from the NDIS and the systemic reform is designed to ensure it continues to meet people's needs long-term. We welcome reforms that strengthen choice and control for participants while making sure the scheme is sustainable for people with a disability and taxpayers.



The Minister had this to say about housing:

"The NDIS Review is already looking at ways to get better home and living decisions for participants. Integral to this is housing supply, rental market accessibility, co-tenancy models, the role of community housing and other innovative housing and accommodation models designed by people with disability and their families to deliver better outcomes."

Our tenancy relations co-ordinators are always out and about meeting with residents and their supported independent living providers. We welcome Hannah to the role in Queensland where our presence is rapidly growing. This month, her NSW counterpart Sarah brings a resident story that will warm your heart and shows the positive impact Specialist Disability Accommodation and good support can have on people's well-being and lives. WARNING! This story will warm your heart!

When one of our Sydney residents moved into her new SDA home mid last year, she had very limited mobility and was on a continuous prescription of high-level pain medication. She is no longer taking pain medication.

Our Tenancy Relations Officer Sarah was with the resident and her occupational therapist recently when she sat up by herself for the very first time since her Stroke.

Sarah says SIL provider The Disability Trust and other support staff have gone above and beyond to assist Kelly. TDT staff say the SDA group home has been the best thing for the resident. They have seen her mental and physical well-being improve beyond words.

Maggie makes her SDA property a home

Maggie has turned her Home in Place managed SDA property in Sydney's Olympic Park into a beautiful oasis.

She had to leave the home she was sharing with her best friend and her friend's brother. Only three months after a call to Home in Place, a very relieved and excited Maggie was given the keys to her new apartment in December 2019.

Since moving in, Maggie has made the apartment a home and improved its functionality. There's a plant filled balcony with a soothing solar powered fountain. Inside, Maggie has used roller drawers to get more use out of storage spaces and wall mounted containers and dispensers to make life easier. All for very little money.

SDA investor tips

Investors in SDA housing need to be realistic about returns and wary of over-promises made by some in the market.

Our Executive Manager Larissa Bridge says investing in SDA isn't the same as investing in mainstream residential or commercial housing with longer lead times and different approvals. She says good returns are possible, albeit sometimes slower, for investors who understand the workings of the NDIS, choose the right location, type of SDA housing, and design and build with an NDIS participant-centred approach.

"If you are relying on cashflow from SDA payments to meet mortgage payments, then SDA may not be the best housing investment for you."
