The Australian Government has announced its response to the Disability Royal Commission to a mixed reaction. It is encouraging that the Government shares the Commission's vision and has a commitment to working in partnership with the disability community to implement reforms to make Australia more inclusive, accessible and safe for people with disability. The true test will be whether it can quickly deliver the co-ordinated reforms we need for a sustainable sector to support positive outcomes for participants.



Another government priority is to help young people with a disability to move from aged care and hospital into more appropriate housing, including specialist disability accommodation. We have a number of these people moving into SDA homes that we manage. In this newsletter we share a wonderful story on how positive the move has been for Jo, who was living in aged care for 17 years.

Are you watching the Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games? It is inspiring to see athletes striving to be the best they can be. Paralympian Jamieson Leeson lives in an SDA property in Sydney that we manage. We will be cheering her on as she goes for gold in Boccia as well as all the other Aussie athletes.

Jo's future is bright after move from aged care to SDA

Jo has just moved into an SDA home after living in aged care for 17 years.

Her sister Donna says the future for Jo looks bright.

"When we found this SDA home, I was hopeful for Jo's future. Now I am excited. This is the best thing that has happened to Jo in years," Donna says.

She says the difference SDA has made to Jo already is significant. Jo has lost weight and is helping to cook for the first time in more than 17 years. She is helping with household tasks which Donna says is good for Jo's sense of identity and self and her mental wellbeing.

Donna has plenty of praise for the quality of the home as well as Jo's supported living provider, Cerebral Palsy Alliance and the team at Home in Place. She also has tips for family members and carers on making the move to SDA housing.

Jamieson going for Gold in Paris

Congratulations to Jamieson Leeson on making the Australian Paralympic boccia team. Jamieson will compete for an individual medal and in the pairs with Daniel Michel in Paris. She and Daniel have already achieved number one ranking in the world for boccia pairs.

Jamieson lives in an SDA apartment in the Sydney suburb of Homebush that we manage. Her home is much closer to training facilities and support while completing her university studies.

With gold and silver world championship medals already in her trophy cabinet, Jamieson's sights set on being the first Aussie to win a Paralympic gold medal in boccia. She says that would mean a lot to her but will also help her quest to promote the sport of boccia and make para sports more accessible to people, especially in regional and rural areas.

Fun facts about Boccia

Did you know that boccia is the Italian word for 'ball'? Developed for people with cerebral palsy, boccia is now played by athletes with other types of locomotor dysfunction in 75 countries.

Boccia is one of only two Paralympic sports that do not have an Olympic counterpart. Like pétanque, boccia requires precision and dexterity. It first appeared at the Paralympic Games in 1984.

In Paris, 124 athletes will compete between August 29 and September 5. This is the first Paralympics where there will be separate individual boccia events for men and women. Team and pairs events will still be mixed. Pairs events have one man and one woman taking part.

Government response to Disability Royal Commission

The Australian Government has announced its response to the Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation of People with Disability (Disability Royal Commission).

The response supports the Commission's vision for an inclusive Australia where people with disability live free from harm; where human rights are protected; and where individuals live with dignity, equality and respect, can take risks, and develop and fulfil their potential.

The Australian Government has primary or shared responsibility for 172 of the Commission's 222 recommendations. Of those 172 recommendations, it:

- accepts or accepts in principle 130
- is considering 36
- notes 6 recommendations.

Other sector news: NDIS pricing review, home mods and grants

- The National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) has announced changes to NDIS pricing including new SDA pricing arrangements and price limits for 2024-25. These are the maximum price limits that NDIS providers and health professionals are permitted to charge when providing services to NDIS participants. The NDIS Review proposed some reforms to pricing and the NDIS market. The NDIA is appointing an independent expert to review the NDIS pricing structure ahead of next year's pricing review. - The <u>set budget levels for home modifications</u> have been updated. The NDIA says it will streamline the process of getting funding for straightforward and lower risk home modifications in an NDIS plan.
- The Peer Support and Capacity Building grant program is a one-off grant round available to community-based services to continue the valuable role they play in the community supporting people with disability, families and carers. The NDIA will communicate when the grants are open via GrantConnect.

Meet the Team: Victoria

Victoria is one of our SDA tenancy relations officers. She has worked in the housing sector since March 2023, initially working for Home in Place as a community housing tenancy relations officer.

Her move to our SDA team in April 2024 has given her the opportunity to expand her knowledge of all forms of helping people to live in appropriate housing. and meet new people.

Victoria says she is enjoying getting out to the SDA homes Home in Place manages.
