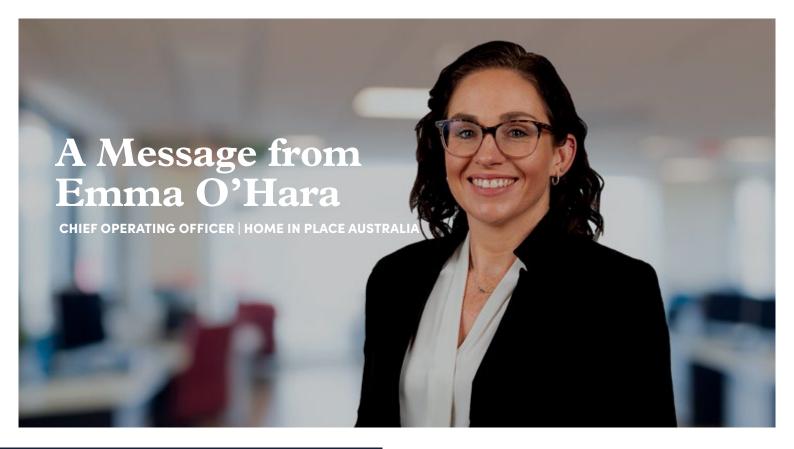

### WHY IS THIS SURVEY SO IMPORTANT?

### **HOW IT WORKS**

To make it easy for everyone to take part, the survey will be delivered in two stages:

After more than two decades of dedicated service Greg Budworth has retired from his role as Group Managing Director. Greg has led the organisation with vision and integrity, guiding its growth from humble beginnings to one of the largest social housing providers in the region.

This growth has not just been about scale, it has been about impact. Greg's passion, vision and strong sense of social justice have helped transform Home in Place into the sector leader it is today.

While his executive responsibilities concluded at the end of June, Mr Budworth remains heavily involved with the organisation as a Non-Executive Director.

Reflecting on the past two decades Mr Budworth said it had been a privilege to lead the company through a period of extensive growth, and he felt the time was right to hand over to a new leader.

"It has been a privilege to lead this organisation and work alongside such a dedicated team. I'm incredibly proud of what we've achieved together," he said.

To ensure continuity and stability the Board has confirmed the appointment of Home in Place's Australian CEO Lyndall Robertshaw as Interim Group CEO

Home in Place Chair Kwesi Addo said Lyndall was a highly respected and long-serving leader within the community housing sector who has played a central role in Home in Place's evolution and growth over the past two decades.

"Lyndall brings a wealth of experience to the role, embodies our values, and is ideally suited to helping Home in Place navigate this change smoothly."

Ms Robertshaw said it was an honour to step into the role at such a pivotal time.

"I want to acknowledge Greg's outstanding leadership over the past 20 years, and the support he has offered to me during our time working together," she said.

"We are incredibly fortunate to have his legacy as the foundation for the opportunities that lie ahead.

"My priority will be on maintaining momentum and focus. Home in Place's vision and mission remain unchanged and I am committed to making sure the incredibly important work we do continues uninterrupted."

Ms Robertshaw, and the Executive Team will lead the organisation with the full confidence and support of the Board, ensuring stability and continuity throughout the transition period.

# Upcoming Rent Reviews: What you need to know

### MARKET RENT REVIEW (NSW AND QLD)

This review compares rent levels for properties like yours with similar homes in the local area. It helps us make sure rents stay fair and competitive with the current market.

By law, we must inform you of any changes to your property's market rent, even if you receive a rebate. If you live in social housing and currently pay the full market rent for your property, and your market rent increases, we recommend contacting your Tenancy Relations Officer to see if you might be eligible for a rebate.

### PERIODIC RENT REVIEW (NSW)

This review happens twice a year and adjusts rents based on factors like CPI increases and policy changes.

You will receive a letter asking for updated income details for all household members aged 18 or over.

It's very important to return this information by the date requested to avoid your rebate being cancelled



### **Green Thumbs**

Our first Green Thumbs Grants program was a great success, with more than 100 tenants receiving support to create personal or shared gardens in the first round.

From veggie patches to flower beds and community spaces, gardens are already taking shape and bringing colour and life to our neighbourhoods.

The second mini round of Green Thumbs has also wrapped up, giving more tenants the chance to refresh their outdoor spaces this spring.

# A life of giving and a new chapter at 77

At 77, Robert is adjusting to life with Parkinson's disease while reflecting on a lifetime of responsibility, compassion and action.

When his father died, Robert became head of the household at just 17. He raised his younger sister and brother, even helping put his brother through university.

That early responsibility shaped his view of the world. If you can help, you do.

Over the years, Robert has lived by that principle. He volunteered in search and rescue, once diving into rough surf to save a man's life. As a bus driver, he often slipped a few dollars to struggling passengers.

"If you are in a position to help other people, do it. That is how I look at it," he says.

A keen cyclist, Robert once rode 900 km from Newcastle to Brisbane to raise money for breast cancer research, helping collect \$41,000 with a small group of riders.

"Some days it poured rain, but you got up and rode," he recalls. "You did it for the people sharing their stories every night."

After almost fifty years of working, retirement did not go as planned. Parkinson's and personal struggles

left him in a difficult place. Moving into a Home in Place property gave him a chance to reset and rebuild. With support from staff like Michael, who helped him access care and set up a new routine, Robert found hope and direction.

"I have always been independent. When I got here I thought, right, this is my little house now and I am going to work to keep it really nice. Not because I own it, but to show respect and gratitude for getting it," he says.

Robert has not been back on the bike yet, but he stays active, visiting the shops, meeting friends and setting up a reading and writing space.

"I may not be able to ride like I used to, but I have still got a story to tell."

Looking back, Robert says he is grateful.

"I have had a good life. I have always given to others. And when I needed help, it came. What goes around comes around. That is something I will never forget."

### ICED VOVO ETON MESS Serves 10

### **INGREDIENTS**

900ml thickened cream
20 pink and white marshmallows, halved
10 pack of large meringue nests
210g packet Iced VoVo biscuits
3/4 cup raspberry jam

### **STEPS**

- 1. Whip cream until soft peaks form, then fold in the jam with a quarter of the marshmallows, meringues and biscuits.
- 2. Spoon one-third of the mixture into a large bowl and sprinkle with another quarter of the marshmallows, meringues and biscuits.
- 3. Repeat twice more, finishing with the remaining marshmallows, meringues and biscuits on top.



### **INGREDIENTS**

2 large ripe mangoes peeled and chopped500 ml vanilla ice cream, softened250 g packet plain sweet biscuits

125 g butter, melted

2 tbsp honey

### **STEPS**

- 1. Line a slice tin with baking paper.
- 2. Crush biscuits and mix with butter. Press into base and chill.
- 3. Blend mango until smooth.
- 4. Mix with ice cream and honey.
- Spread over base and freeze until firm. Slice to serve.

### HONEY-SOY SALMON WITH CORN SALSA Serves 4

### **INGREDIENTS**

4 salmon fillets

2 tbsp honey

2 tbsp soy sauce

2 corn cobs

Juice of 1 lime

### STEPS

- 1. Mix honey, soy and lime to make the glaze.
- 2. Brush salmon with glaze and grill until cooked.
- Grill corn, cut off kernels and mix with lime juice.
- 4. Serve salmon topped with corn salsa.



### ROASTED PUMPKIN AND FETA SALAD Serves 4-6

### **INGREDIENTS**

1 kg butternut pumpkin, chopped 200 g feta, crumbled

2 tbsp olive oil

1 tbsp balsamic vinegar

Handful fresh mint leaves

### **STEPS**

- 1. Preheat oven to 200 °C. Toss pumpkin with oil and season.
- 2. Roast 25-30 min until caramelised.
- Transfer to a serving bowl, sprinkle feta and mint
- 4. Drizzle balsamic before serving.

### PRAWN AND AVOCADO LETTUCE CUPS Serves 6

### **INGREDIENTS**

300 g cooked prawns, peeled and chopped

2 ripe avocados, diced

1 small red onion, finely chopped

Juice of 1 lemon

12 small lettuce leaves (cos or iceberg)

### **STEPS**

- 1. Combine prawns, avocado, onion and lemon juice in a bowl.
- 2. Season with salt and pepper.
- 3. Spoon mixture into lettuce leaves.
- 4. Serve chilled as a light starter or party snack.

# Farewell Tom

A decade of dedication to tenant voice

For more than ten years, Tom Hall has been a passionate advocate for tenants at Home in Place, helping to shape services through his leadership, insight and persistence.

His retirement from the Tenant Reference Group (TRG) and Our Voice Panel marks the end of an extraordinary contribution.

A Central Coast tenant since 2012, Tom brought practical experience and a solutions-focused approach. After careers in architecture, sales management and the NSW Police Force, he and his wife became the first tenants in a Compassmanaged property in Gosford before moving to Wyong.

Tom joined the TRG in 2019 and later chaired the Our Voice Panel from 2022. He championed improvements such as the tenant portal and a local call centre, strengthening links between tenants and senior decision–makers.

At his farewell lunch, colleagues praised his clarity, tenacity and empathy. Former Board Chair Paul Johnston said he could "take a problem and find a solution," while CEO Lyndall Robertshaw commended his "incredible effort and lasting impact".

Tom was humble, encouraging more tenants to get involved.

"When there are six and a half thousand homes being looked after in New South Wales, and only a few people putting their hand up, you're not getting the full input," he said. "You just have to take over and hope you get it right."

Though stepping back from formal roles, Tom remains active in his community.

Home in Place thanks Tom for his service, leadership and care for others.
